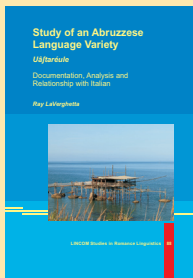
Study of an Abruzzese Language Variety

This study presents a thorough grammatical description of one of the less well-known languages spoken on the Italian peninsula - Abruzzese, specifically the variety spoken in Vasto, in the province of Chieti, known as Uâġtaréule among its native speakers.

Included in the study is a detailed analysis of the variety's syntax, which is the component of grammar that researchers have traditionally studied the least when examining the Latin-derived, non-Italian languages spoken on the peninsula. The study also provides a careful description of the variety's sound system, its morphology, its extensive linguistic variation along multiple dimensions, and the significant language contact phenomena that have influenced its grammar as well as the grammar of the regional Italian spoken in the area.

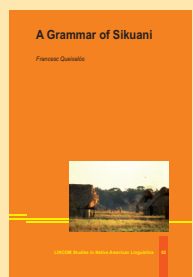
Finally, it explains in accessible terms for the local language community the true character and value of its linguistic patrimony and suggests possible options for ensuring the viability of the variety going forward.

A Grammar of Sikuaní

This is a new descriptive grammar of Sikuaní, a language of the Guahibo family spoken in the mid Orinoco grasslands of Colombia and the jungle-covered ridges of Venezuela. The book, written in English, condenses down to one third a two-volume 950-page grammar published in French between 1998 and 2000. The analyses sometimes diverge from the previous version given that in the meantime the author's understanding of languages and linguistics has in some way changed - hopefully for better. Ten chapters cover the different topics in morphology, syntax and the discourse manipulation of both for the sake of communicative strategies. A final chapter deals with phonology and morphophonology.

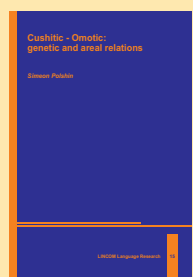
Illustrative examples are generously supplied, with non abbreviated glosses as often as possible to ease the reader's processing. Follow a list of grammatical morphemes and glosses, a bibliography, as well as a 10-page traditional text translated and broadly segmented. On typology grounds, the language - polysynthetic to a high degree - is noteworthy for the productivity of its nominalising devices. It also shines a light on how a verb lexicon, along with morphology and clause syntax, can embody complex and refined spatial notions.

Cushitic - Omotic: genetic and areal relations

Simeon Polshin

Genetic and areal relations between Cushitic and Omotic languages are re-examined using the method of stepwise reconstruction. To this end, the list of about 180 most stable basic meanings is prepared. Proto-East and South Cushitic, Proto-North and South Omotic basic lexicons are reconstructed within this wordlist together with regular phonemic correspondences between daughter languages of these families.

Main types of root structure in these proto-languages and patterns of their evolution in the daughter ones are established. These intermediate proto-languages are compared with the remaining Cushitic and Omotic languages, namely with Beja, Central Cushitic (Agaw), and Mao. Regular phonemic correspondences between these (proto-) languages are found, and the proto-Cushito-Omotic basic lexicon is reconstructed. By comparing these (proto-)languages with each other and with Proto-Semitic, it is argued that the oldest Afro-Asiatic lexical stratum in Omotic is borrowed from the otherwise unknown Cushitic subgroup, and before this borrowing North and South Omotic have had nothing to do neither with each other nor with the Afro-Asiatic macro-phylum.

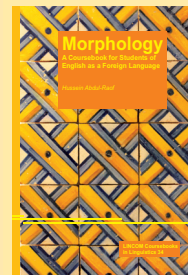

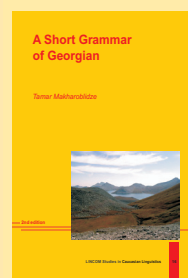

Georgian is the official language of Georgia. It's the primary language of about 3.9 million people in Georgia itself (about 83 percent of the population), and of another 500,000 abroad (chiefly in Turkey, Iran, Russia, USA and Europe). It is the literary language for all ethnographic groups of Georgian people, especially those who speak other South Caucasian languages (or Kartvelian

languages).

Georgian can be characterised as an agglutinative language. It shows split ergativity, poly-personal verbal constructions and has a subject-verb-object primary sentence structure.

A Short Grammar of Georgian starts with a presentation of the Georgian writing system. The following chapters discuss nominal and verbal morphology with a special focus on poly-personal verbal conjugation. The data is presented in a very simple way so that one can learn the general items of Georgian Grammar rather easily.

Besides the clear short description of Georgian grammar categories in traditional terms the author exposes some original views of the most complicated categories: such as version, personality, ergativity, destination and class-category.

This second edition has been expanded by several examples of verbal conjugation.

Introducing Minimalism: A Parametric Variation

Introducing Minimalism: A Parametric Variation introduces the currently advocated syntactic theory known as *Minimalism*. It gives the reader a concise and precise introduction to the essential notions and concepts made use of by Chomsky in his biological approach to the study of language and how they help minimize the linguistic apparatus and machinery needed to describe natural language as a universal phenomenon. The book begins with providing a generative approach to language acquisition, then addressing how syntax theorization develops since Chomsky's Syntactic Structures 1957 to Minimalism, which was tackled in chapter 2. Chapter 3 addresses Structural Relations and Operations. INFL-split was developed in Chapter 4, and Chapter 5 addresses Features and Agreement. Chapter 6 spells out Head and Phrasal Movements, and Wh-movement was addressed in Chapter 7. Chapter 8 examines Null Categories, and Chapter 9 was devoted to Projection Split, where VP, TP, DP, CP, etc. were split, and the syntactic justifications of splitting each. The book concludes with outlining Phase theory, the latest development in syntax inquiry.

Each Chapter discusses the minimalist assumptions of the syntactic phenomenon it addresses in several languages to characterize language parametrization among these languages, applying the minimalist machinery apparatus to derive, by means of phrase markers, the phrases, clauses and sentences exemplified. Each Chapter ends with a bunch of exercises, in which students have a good chance to exercise the knowledge acquired in the Chapter. Though the book is a text, meant for graduate and postgraduate students, it is also a valuable reference for syntax scholars, in general, and Arabic syntax scholars, in particular.

This book is a collection of 200 puzzles intended to provide challenges in logical thinking. The puzzles engage the reader in drawing conclusions from given information, establishing connections among facts in statements, or else inferring what elements are related to each other. No special background knowledge is required, other than elementary arithmetic for some of the puzzles.

The puzzles are spread over the ten chapters with answers at the back. Each chapter contains a specific type of puzzle, and includes an introductory part explaining and illustrating what is involved in solving the puzzles presented in the chapter. This book can be used by beginners as a self-study manual in logical thinking that will give them plenty of exposure to its basic principles and techniques via puzzle-solving, or by inveterate puzzle-solver as a collection of logic puzzles, which may provide some challenge to such a reader.

A Grammar of Doromu-Koki

Robert L. Bradshaw

A Grammar of Doromu-Koki covers major features of this formerly minimally described language of Papua New Guinea. This Papuan language, which has been classified as Southeast Manubaran, is spoken by approximately 2,000 speakers. Half reside in the original community area, located in the Owen Stanley ranges to the east-southeast of the capital, Port Moresby, while the remainder are currently living and working there in the capital.

This analysis includes culturally appropriate examples from a corpus collected over a period of 18 years. It follows the *Basic Linguistic Theory* (Dixon 2010a, 2010b and 2012) and *The Art of Grammar* (Aikhenvald 2015c) framework. The following core aspects of the language studied include: phonology and morphophonology, word classes, complex predicates and verb phrase structure, clause types and structure, clause combining, discourse-pragmatic devices and features of the lexicon. The analysis seeks to promote the preservation of an already endangered language for the benefit of its speakers, and also for linguistic and anthropological scholarship.

Textual examples are supplemented by forty-two interlinearised texts of several genres. Indices further specify details of these texts and any others cited in the analysis. Various interesting lexical items include: homonyms, lexeme senses, verbal semantics, autochthonous versus borrowed synonyms, idioms, borrowed terms and biblical translation key terms. The work

concludes with a vocabulary list of all Doromu-Koki words and affixes found therein.

The purpose of this dictionary is as a repository of an endangered language, serving as a means of preserving the linguistic and cultural heritage of the Doromu-Koki people for generations to come.

The most compelling evidence to date for involvement of the Basal Ganglia (BG) (Basal Ganglia Grammar) in natural language comes to us from theoretical movement operations (nested dependency, distant binding and trace-theory). This implication of BG overlaps with well-established evidence showing Broca's involvement with movement. Dual pathways are a marked characteristic of BG insofar that in cascading down-stream neural networks, both direct as well as indirect paths affect admixed neuronal populations from multiple cortical areas.

A tentative proposal may suggest that any notion of duality at the subcortical level may have the ability to simulate what we know of local vs distant binding dependencies as found in Dual Mechanism Model accounts of natural language. A theoretical (meta)-synthesis which seeks to connect what we know of Natural Language (NL) with current trends in AI/Transformers may offer us a potential merging of what has up until now been two quite disparate underlying systems. If we assume that NL systems mirror what we find in Parallel Distributed Processing (PDP) across neural networks and via extension be applicable to any putative AI/Transformer-to-NL corollary then, by definition, some component of the PDP would necessarily entail a capacity-state which corresponds to concepts, symbols and categorial rules i.e., real recursive-based prerequisites for natural language which up until now have been sidelined in the implementation of AI modeling.

Topics, Topic Chains, and Null Subjects Interpretation in Mandarin Chinese

Marco Casentini

The present analysis builds upon and extends proposals from recent research regarding the interpretation of null subjects (NSs) in consistent and partial NS languages. These proposals suggest that the interpretation of a NS depends on its con-

nection to a specific type of Topic, notably the Aboutness-Shift Topic (A-Topic), which initiates a Topic chain (cf. Frascarelli 2007). The investigation seeks to determine: (i) whether NSs in Chinese are interpreted within a topical chain headed by an A-Topic, and (ii) if different types of Topics occupy distinct positions in the left periphery of sentences and exhibit specific prosodic features, despite the tonal nature of Chinese.

This work will present an analysis demonstrating the necessity of distinguishing between Aboutness-Shift, Contrastive, and Given Topics in Chinese, based on a prosodic and contextual examination of 852 tokens obtained from an oral production experiment specifically designed for this study, in addition to data from the analysis of two unscripted interviews. The collected data will also be analyzed to establish the existence of a Topic hierarchy in Chinese. Additionally, the data will demonstrate that even in a radical NS language like Mandarin Chinese, NSs rely on a linking relation with the A-Topic heading a Topic chain.

Slavery and Feminism in the Writings of Madame de Staël

In France, the late eighteenth-century was a turbulent period when the Ancien Régime was overthrown and the Revolution transformed all political and social institutions. Recent historians have argued that intellectual ideas that promoted the Enlightenment principles of knowledge, freedom and natural law played a major role for radicalising the Revolution. Through her writings, the liberal Anne-Louise Germaine de Staël (1766-1817) commented on her community and on the political regimes of her time. She also devoted her life and her work to the idea of freedom and equality particularly for women and for slaves.

A moderate 'feminist', she advocated gender equality and social justice while highlighting the traditional female values that could be beneficial to society. De Staël's work stands out, however, when she establishes a link between feminism and abolitionism. Like the works of other feminists at the turn of the nineteenth-century, she introduced the notion of 'enslavement' of married women.

Like slaves, married women suffered from physical and cultural restrictions because they were denied civil rights and were treated as property. Moreover, de Staël added another notion of 'enslavement' when she portrayed women as victims of their passion, the strong feminine emotions that could be destructive and causing a loss of autonomy, identity and self-control, the same predicaments suffered by the slaves. This study demonstrates how feminism and abolitionism interacted and intersected in the work of Madame de Staël.

Focus in Italian: an experimental interface approach

Giorgio Carella

This study deals with the use of Focus in Italian, adopting an interface perspective that takes into account the interactions between the different levels of analysis involved. This research concentrates on three types of Focus (i.e., Information Focus, Corrective Focus and Mirative Focus) and is aimed at investigating (i) the syntactic and prosodic properties of the three Foci, and (ii) their behaviour in different embedded contexts.

In order to achieve these goals a written acceptability judgment test has been designed and distributed to 120 native speakers of the Italian variety spoken in Lazio. Since initial test results generated new queries, subsequent tests on production and prosodic aspects have been designed and run.

The analysis of experimental data suggests that in-situ positioning is preferred for all Focus types syntactically, with fronting being less acceptable. Prosodically, the canonical intonation linked with Focus is identified as H*+L contour, while a rising L+H* tone validates the 'discourse salience' of the focused element, marking an Intonational Boundary. These findings suggest independent Intonational Phrases for Focus constituents, aligning with previous proposals.

The study, organized across four Chapters, concludes by consolidating the diverse test outcomes and proposing a comprehensive analysis.

The lacuna was determined based on the findings of the needs analysis, followed by a pilot study. Three instructional modules were prepared for a 40-hour experimental study.

The effectiveness of the newly designed approach was rigorously investigated using a pretest-posttest of the control and experimental groups. The results indicated that the experimental group achieved positive results. The study established that the approach, namely 'the process approach supported by the multimedia technology for teaching writing skills in English to the ESL learners at the tertiary level,' has led to the considerable skill development of the learners. Thus, the efficiency of the new technique was proved.

La lengua cueva se habló en las secciones central y oriental de la actual República de Panamá hasta el siglo XVI y fue una de las lenguas más importantes durante la temprana conquista de Tierra Firme.

Dada su escasa documentación y la rapidez con la que se extinguió, este idioma ha representado un enigma para la ciencia lingüística del continente americano, y son muchas las personas que han querido ver en la lengua cueva características de muchas otras lenguas del área, particularmente con las lenguas de la familia chibcha y caribe. En el presente estudio se descartan dichos parentescos y se corrobora su afiliación filogenética a la familia chocó.

Sobre la base de los rubros léxicos legados por los cronistas de la época – palabras comunes, antropónimos, topónimos – se ha podido realizar una reconstrucción de sus estructuras fónica y gramatical. En el presente libro se ofrece dicha descripción, además de una lista del léxico y de nombres propios de la época que sirvieron de corpus.

Además, se ofrece un estudio histórico-comparativo y se propone una nueva clasificación filogenética de la familia chocó, tomando en cuenta el nuevo miembro de la familia.

Las lenguas del Caribe continental: Estudio sobre arealidad incipiente

Este trabajo plantea la posibilidad de identificar una zona geográfica, el *Caribe continental*, que se extiende desde la península de Yucatán, México, hasta el delta del Orinoco, Venezuela, como zona de relevancia. Se trata de una franja compuesta en su mayoría de llanuras a lo largo de la costa, generalmente separadas del resto de cada país por una cordillera montañosa, con clima tropical húmedo y lluvioso la mayor parte del año, con historias recientes compartidas y con migraciones constantes a lo interno del área (asi como hacia y desde el Caribe insular).

Para ello se realizó un inventario de las lenguas del potencial área y mediante la comparación de una serie de fenómenos lingüísticos, se procedió a determinar la existencia de rasgos compartidos. The Nebé Language

The Nebé Language is a description of a previously unknown language. Nebé is a member of the Cochimian languages, which also includes Gabb Cochimi, Jesuit Cochimi, and Robinia. The Cochimian languages were spoken in the middle half of the Baja California peninsula. The Cochimian languages are probably related to the Yuman family of languages. The Nebé Language provides data for comparative Cochimian phonology, as well as Nebé morphosyntax which may be compared with the grammar of Jesuit Cochimi.

The study of comparative Cochimian and comparative Yuman will yield information on the linguistic prehistory of Baja California. The Nebé data dates from around 1680. The Cochimian Languages

David Leedom Shaul

The Cochimian language family of central Baja California has been linked to the languages of the Yuman family. This contribution surveys the four Cochimian languages - Jesuit Cochimi, Gabb Cochimi, Robinia, and Nebé - in order to assess the family's phonological and morphological correspondences. The sound patterns of these languages are re-markably similar, with phono-logical divergence in some Nebé roots. Prefixes and suffixes (both

derivational and inflectional) clearly reconstruct for Proto-Cochimian. Cognate rates among the four languages range from 30% to 34%.

Almost all Cochimian languages are ergative-absolutive in case marking, except Hervas Cochimi, a dialect of Jesuit Cochimi, which has nominative-accusative case marking like Yuman, and the Hervas case markers cognate with Yuman. Also, Hervas Cochimi has switch-reference, using the same markers as Yuman. Switch-reference is absent in other Cochimian languages for which we have data (non-Hervas Jesuit Cochimi, Nebé). The Nebé language is treated in a companion volume. Texts in the Cochimian languages are reproduced with complete analysis, with a comparative lexicon and index. Lastly, the Monqui language of the southern range of Cochimian is shown to be a variety of Nebé.

This document is a parallel research on prepositions in English and case marking and adpositions in Finnish (ADPOS-CASE relators) which consists of a three-fold system of locative and de- and adlocative relators and circumstantial relators bound with various syntactic positions. The three-fold system of relators is examined with respect to their occurrences in three-dimensional space based on the closure of space and distances between objects. The ADPOS-CASE relators in the parallel database are extracted with the help of rules which structurally are Regular Expressions, and ambiguous results are examined with the help of disambiguation rules. Various statistical methods are used in revealing differences between structural systems of languages.

The statistical model Self-Organizing Maps is used in examining the organization of ADPOS-CASE relators and also clusters of relators in combination with various semantic groups of verbs. For evaluating the value of semantic categories used in the analysis of English and Finnish, descriptions of ADPOS-CASE relators are extended to concern some Indo-European and Finno-Ugric languages and a Malayo-Polynesian language. The parallel database used as research material consists of English and Finnish translations of the Bible in the machine-readable form.

It is shown that, instead of comparing structural categories of languages as such, it is possible to examine the distribution of the ADPOS-CASE relators with respect to semantic categories which are independent from the surface grammar. Disambiguation of the results extracted from the database completes information expressed with grammatical rules. In Finnish which has rich morphology, most disambiguation rules deal with morphological categories, but in English in which differentiation of lexical categories is weaker, disambiguation concerns, in addition to lexical, also phrasal units. A special value of statistical methods is shown in opening clusters of properties in investigating interaction between properties of languages.

Within the list of approx. 180 selected basic meanings such as 'black', 'hand', 'rain' etc, a lexical database of approx. 45 Indo-Iranian languages, including such rarely accessed ones as Dardic and Nuristani, is prepared. By applying the methods of historical linguistics, this lexical database allows answering the following questions.

1. Internal classification of Indo-Iranian languages using quantitative methods. This includes the following topics. 1.1. New subgroup of Indo-Iranian languages of those called "outer" ones is detected. 1.2. ly on their common ancestor.

3. Historical phonology of Indo-Iranian languages is studied for the first time on its own right, not simply as an exponent of the assumed Proto-Indo-European one. Rows of regular phonemic correspondences between Indo-Iranian languages are identified and the phonemic values of proto-phonemes lying behind these rows are discussed, in particular the nature of Indo-Iranian aspirated stops, and the reflex of Indo-European palato-alveolar *k'.

4. Within the above-mentioned list of basic meanings, Proto-Indo-Iranian basic lexicon is reconstructed in the form of approx. 400 proto-roots; only about 150 of them have reflexes both in Sanskrit and Avestan, which justify the need to go beyond the usual Sanskrit-Avestan comparisons. Etymological dictionaries of concrete Indo-Iranian languages such as Sanskrit, Ossetic, and Khotanese, are extensively used.

Oz is an artificial auxiliary language created by Charles Milton Elam. In spite of its name, it was a serious project. It belongs to the a priori group of artificial languages, i.e. it did not take anything from natural languages, as Esperanto did.

The only known work on the language is a book by Elam entitled *The Case for an A Priori Language*, published in 1932, and it is one of the more obscure artificial languages. This book did not include a dictionary or glossary, and so the present dictionary has been created. It includes almost all of the Oz words and morphemes occurring in Elam's book; in some cases it has been difficult to be sure of the meaning of a item, or whether it is a root or a stem; such facts have been noted. Oz has elaborate systems of terms for colors, chemical elements, and family terms, in spite of the fact that most such terms will rarely be used. There is also a complex system of tenses. This dictionary will give a picture of a highly unusual artificial language.

Castilian Spanish spontaneous speech: A phonetic analysis of its segments

The vast majority of phonetic research on Spanish segments has examined either read speech or speech elicited under carefully controlled conditions for the purpose of linguistic analysis. While such control is often necessary, one must be cautious in assuming that the results of analyzing such data are representative of speaker behavior more broadly.

By examining naturally occurring speech, this book provides an overview of the range of speech productions of the various sounds of Castilian Spanish that occur in spontaneous speech. The expectation that a wider range of speech productions would be found in spontaneous speech than has been claimed previously is borne out throughout the chapters of this book. While some groups of sounds (e.g., nasals and liquids) showed little (though some) variation from what has been claimed in previous work, many showed a considerably wider range of realizations. For example, vowels showed more variability and overlap between categories than previously noted and many of the obstruent productions included articulations that have not previously been documented. Northeast Geg is a variety of the Albanian language mainly spoken in Northeast Albania and Kosovo. Albanian is an isolate within the Indo-Euro-pean language family. Spoken Geg is especially under-researched, also because of its almost absence in Standard Albanian, which is based on the southern Tosk dialect. The Geg dialect has infinitives consisting of the particle 'me' and a participle, where Tosk uses subjunctive constructions, a future tense built with the auxiliary 'to have' and the infinitive, where Tosk uses the auxiliary 'to want' and a

subjunctive construction, and different uses of certain tenses like the imperfect (also with different forms than in Tosk).

This sketch grammar describes the variety of the two cities Suhareka and Zaqishti in southern Kosovo based upon the data collection of twelve native speakers of said region, including monologic narrations as well as elicitations. Three issues that intervene in the process of translation are namely ideology, culture, and power. The most dangerous interventions are caused by ideology in totalitarian regimes. Ideological orientations interfere with power relations and cultural items as well as literary production and translation. However, ideology is hidden in any language use, its meaning is embedded in any text or discourse, and its manipulative power has been enacted at any level in the process of translation. In the 50s and 60s, translators began to evaluate the techniques to affect the target audience through translation. They began to consider how to ideologically manipulate the texts to achieve this goal. Referring to Lefevre's (1992) view, by a means of translation it is possible to motivate a nation's ideological dogmatism or racism, and to engage the world in an ideological battle since as a main policy, ideology exists at any level of translation.

The ideological translation can be seen as a threat to the national identity, culture, and power in society. To cope with such a problem in translation, power controls the filtering process by all means. Yet it not only controls the linguistics property of the text but the cultural/ ideological aspects of the text and the sociopolitical situation in which the text is produced and comprehended.

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A Grammar of Lhowa

This grammar, within the framework of adaptive approach, describes and analyzes phonological and grammatical codes in Lhowa, a southern Tibetic language, and compares them with those in Lhasa Tibetan and other Central Bodish languages from typological perspective. Lhowa, a tonal language, exhibits high-front and mid-front rounded vowels, murmured plosives and voiceless lateral. Typologically, it is an agglutinating and consistently ergative language. Nouns are not marked for grammatical gender and number for agreement in the complex of the verbs. However, they are marked for three numbers (viz., singular vs. dual vs. plural) and twelve case-roles. Lhowa distinguishes personal pronouns in terms of social standing (viz., ordinary vs. honorific) and clusivity (viz., inclusive vs. exclusive) in the first person plural. Adjectives, numerals and quantifiers follow the nouns whereas demonstratives and possessive pronouns precede the nouns.

In Lhowa, tense markers interact with aspect, modality and eventuality. Besides, Lhowa presents a verb agreement system which is closely related to conjunct-disjunct distinction. Especially, egophoricity (viz., marking distinctly for the first person) in the past tense is governed exclusively by volitionality. Egophoricity is also evident in essential and existential copulas. Like in Tibetan, tense is deduced from the general context of the text. Lhowa, a dependent marking and extremely nominalizing language, registers non-promotional type of passive.

As a Tibetic language, Lhowa shares a number of phonological and grammatical coding devices with Lhasa Tibetan and languages belonging to gTasang cluster of Central Bodish. However, due to inter-language contact, Lhowa exhibits some contact induced changes in the phonological and grammatical coding devices which Lhasa Tibetan and other members of gTasang cluster do not normally display.
